
## MATSEC: What do teachers think of the current MATSEC (SEC) System?

Answered: 191 Skipped: 63



#### Q25 Do you find difficulties in aligning the school syllabus with the SEC?





## Q26 Do you agree with access arrangements for students sitting for SEC exams?







#### Q28 Has the preparation and correction of project work for SEC improved in the past years?





## Q29 Do you think that the SEC syllabus is too demanding on students?





## Q30 Do you think that the SEC syllabus is too demanding on teachers?





#### Q31 Are you satisfied with the level of moderation of SEC project work?



- Project work is given few marks for the work done by the students.


## Q32 Are you in agreement about the current duplication of assessment tasks in Form 5 consisting of an annual exam followed by SEC?

#### Q33 Do you agree about the introduction of SEC continuous assessment in some subjects such as VET subjects?








